






School Board Election Wednesday, November 13, 2024

The school division is divided into ONE (1) CITY SUBDIVISION in which FIVE (5) BOARD MEMBERS are to be elected and FIVE (5) RURAL SUBDIVISIONS in which ONE (1) BOARD MEMBER from each

Qualifications of Candidates....

A person is eligible to be nominated as a candidate for and hold office as a **BOARD MEMBER** for a sch division if the person:

- (a) is a voter of the school division on the day of the election;
 (b) is a Canadian citizen at the time he or she submits his or her nomination paper; and

- (c) has resided:

 in the school division for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the date on which he or she submitted the nomination paper; and

 in Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months immediately preceding the date on which he or she submitted the nomination paper.

te to run in the IN-CITY SUBDIVISION AREA or ONE of the FIVE OUT-OF-CITY AREAS of the school division, regardless of his or her residency in the division; however, he or she must obtain signatures of voters of only that subdivision area in which he or she intends to run.

Nomination Forms....

A person may be nominated as a candidate for election by filing a nominate by ten voters residing in the subdivision in which he or she intends to run.

Filing Nomination Papers....

Nominations will be received by election officials during regular office hours from September 23 until October 8 and on Nomination Day, Wednesday, the 9th day of October, 2024 from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. at the following locations:

- Rural Subdivisions at the Education Centre, Saskatchewan Rivers Public School Division No. 119 545 11th Street East, Prince Albert, Saskatchewan S6V 1B1 (regular office hours are 8:00 a.m. until noon and 1:00 p.m. 4:30 p.m.)
- In-City Subdivisions at the City of Prince Albert, 1084 Central Avenue, Prince Albert S6V 7P3 (regular office hours are $8:00~\rm a.m.-4:45~p.m.$)

Nomination papers may be submitted personally or by agent by personal service, by registered mail, by ordinary mail, by fax, by email or as otherwise specified by the returning officer and must be accompanied by a non-refundable deposit of \$100 or by a certified cheque or money order in that amount made payable to the Saskatchewan Rivers Public School Division.
